

Davidson County 2016 4-H Summer Fun Registration Policy PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!!!!!

- A completed registration packet is required for each participant. Included in the packet is a registration form, 4-H enrollment form with media release and code of conduct understanding, and medical release form (notary signature required free notary services available at the 4-H Office). All completed forms and registration fees will need to be returned by the registration deadline of **Tuesday, May 31st at 5:00 pm**. You may obtain the registration pack at the 4-H Office between our operating hours of Monday Friday, 8:00 am 5:00 pm. Please call the 4-H Office if you would like the forms faxed or emailed to you. They can also be found on our website: davdison.ces.ncsu.edu. We will accept completed registrations and payment via mail or walk-in.
- 2. Registration is based on a first come, first served basis. Registration is not finalized until all required forms are completed and fees are received. Youth who do not have these items turned in before the deadline date will be dropped from the register. Workshop spaces will not be saved.
- Payments can be made with exact cash or check. Checks should be made out to "Davidson County 4-H" and sent to Davidson County 4-H, 301 East Center Street, Lexington, NC 27292. (Please note that we may not have change for cash payments.)
- 4. Please note the registration deadline date. If a class minimum is not met by the deadline, the class will be cancelled. Refunds will be given only if the class is cancelled or is full when we receive your registration. If a class is full, your child will be placed on a waiting list. Refunds will not be given for absent participants.
- Youth should not be dropped off earlier than 15 minutes prior to class start time and should be picked up no later than 15 minutes after the class ends. Neither class instructor nor the 4-H Staff will be responsible for your child other than the times stated for class time.
- 6. Class age range is important. Classes are designed specifically with age appropriate activities. Do not register a child if they do not meet the age requirements. Ages listed are state-required "4-H Ages" (the age of the child on January 1st).
- 7. Adults required to assist participating youth may also have to pay registration fees to workshops and admission fees for trips. Workshop limits that are specified are for youth only. Due to space limitations for transportation, adults may have to drive their personal vehicle on field trips. We welcome adult volunteers to assist with the workshops. Those who are interested in volunteering are required by the state to fill out a 4-H Adult Episodic Volunteer Application.
- 8. We reserve the right to suspend your child from the program without refund should he/she becomes disruptive or violates the state-mandated Code of Conduct. If this happens, the parent or guardian will be called to pick up the child immediately and may be asked not to participate in future programs.
